A Man of Laughter and Kindness

Dennis Ward Lynn was a life-long restaurateur in West Los Angeles and Santa Monica. He had a passion for the beach, was incredibly gregarious, had an amazing wit and was kind to the core, exemplified by the care he gave his mother Florence during the last seven years of her life.

Born in St. John's Hospital, Santa Monica, CA, Dennis attended the Sunshine Day School in Brentwood, followed by John Thomas Dye School (JTD) in Bel-Air where, at age 5, he entered "Primary", the class prior to first grade. His teacher that year was..... "Ms. Dixie" He attended JTD through sixth grade, then moved into seventh grade at Harvard High School (now Harvard-Westlake) in Studio City in the fall of 1968, where he remained through senior year, graduating in 1974. In 1968 Harvard High School was a military academy, so you can imagine how much our "beach-loving" friend enjoyed wearing his junior ROTC uniform and completing the daily drills with John (Alison) in E Company, First Platoon under the kind eye of Mr. Roberts or roll call in the last row with Haddad, Healey, Hawkins, Irvine and Peter Jones.

The quotes on his senior page in the Harvard yearbook tell much about how he valued friendship. "If words came as ready as ideas, and ideas as feelings, I could say ten hundred kind things. You know not my supreme happiness at having one on earth whom I can call friend." - Charles Lamd "True friendship is like sound health, the value of it is seldom known until it be lost." - Charles Colton

In the summer of '74, Dennis began his first stint working at Brian Montgomery's Razzle Dazzle restaurant in Santa Monica (his salary....\$1.85/hour, plus tips!). In September '74, Dennis began his college years at Cal-Berkeley, where he pledged the Delta-Upsilon fraternity and ultimately became its president. The following summer of '75, Den worked at Brian's other restaurant in Malibu, Beecher's Café. He returned to Razzle Dazzle during the summers of '76, '77 and '78, then during the spring of '79, while finishing Cal, Den worked across the bay at Tarik's Restaurant in downtown San Francisco. In June, he graduated Cal with a double major in Education and Psychology, because he loved working with kids and hoped to do so following his restaurant career.

After Cal, Dennis returned "again" to Razzle Dazzle, where he worked from August '79 until it closed in October '79, at which point he took over management of Pelican's Nest in Santa Monica from October '79 - January '86. In 1982, Dennis received a certificate in Restaurant Management from the UCLA Extension.

From March '86 until December '89, Dennis served as assistant manager at Angie's Restaurant in West L.A.; then in the same role at the Brentwood Inn Restaurant from December '89 until September '92. A brief foray away from food and beverage had him working at Robinson's May from October '92 until August '93 and at Montgomery Design starting in August '93. Subsequently, Dennis worked at a variety of restaurants on the West Side including Café' Milano, Vincenti and The Regency Club in the late '90s, then a long stint from Sept '99 – October '04 at Hotel Casa Del Mar, and finally Wilshire Restaurant from September '05 until early 2011, where he finished his restaurant career.

In the summer of 2011, Dennis moved to Big Bear, CA where he lived until he came down from the mountain due to his poor health in April of this year, soon moving into the home of his cousin Jim Waddell and wife Janine in Lake Forest, CA. Dennis was at peace at the end of his life, in the wonderful care of his family, the Waddells, with humor that we will always cherish.
